- 6) MCSD Police Report; Specialist Carlos Tavarez (936) 442-7797, 281-210-2025, 281-364-4253, Option 3 The police report was presented by Specialist Brian Aguliar. Specialist Aguliar was accompanied by a young man from Lone Star College's Life Path program for neurodiverse students.

After the regular police report Specialist Aguliar bought attention to the Sheriff's App, increased crime while shopping during the holiday season, the community Amber Card program, bank jugging (when someone follows you from a bank after the withdraw of funds, breaks into your vehicle to steal what was retrieved from the bank), and the ongoing autism program.

 BBQ follow up:
 - Start seeking sponsors early (November, December) so perspective sponsors can allocate into their operational budgets.
 - Solicit sponsors for the whole year vs. select events. Offer discounts to year long sponsors.
 - Send thank you letters / notes to 2023 event sponsors. Have board members reach out to sponsors they secured to thank them on behalf of the SRVA board.
 - Review special event insurance for capacity limit.
 - Discussion if event sponsors can sell their goods and services at the event, including campaigning for political office.
 - Adapt more professional marketing techniques, using social media platforms, posting sponsor interviews.
 - Form a marketing / advertising committee to explore best practices for marketing outreach.

b. Discuss and approve the 2024 SRVA Annual Budget.

The Treasurer and President remined the board members of several things, including two types of funds in the SRVA budget.

SRVA is a non-profit, the budget assumes all proceeds that are collected are also spent within the calendar year. Although non-profit organizations are expected to spend all proceeds received, many have a reserve fund for unexpected operational shortfalls. Reserve funds for non-profits are typically 30% of the annual budget.

Restricted funds can only be used for the benefit of The Woodlands Township, these are funds received from the Township through a contract signed annually by the SRVA President, the contract outlines use of restricted funds.

Unrestricted funds are donor / sponsorship funds. They can be used for donations to the schools, scholarships or other uses approved by the SRVA board.

Preliminary review of the 2023 BBQ sponsorship and budget costs indicate the event will be cash positive by \$1,500.00 or break even.

- After discussions surrounding the 1st Annual SRVA golf tournament. The SRVA board voted on two motions regarding event proceeds.
 - Motion 1 was made by Mr. Schwarzkopf and seconded my Mr. Lederman states \$7,500.00 in proceeds to be distributed amongst three elementary that serve Sterling Ridge residents. The motion passed without additional discussion. Each school will be presented with \$2,500.00 each to school in December 2023.
 - Motion 2 was made by Mr. Schwarzkopf and seconded my Mr. Lederman states \$7,500.00 in proceeds will be carried over the fiscal year 2024 and dispersed as scholarships in 2024. The motion passed without additional discussion.
- Other budget items voted on and passed include:
 - o Increase marketing/advertising budget by \$900.00 to \$1,000.00.
 - Leave insurance amount at current level of \$2,900.00.
 - Adjust interest allocation from \$600.00 to \$300.00.

c. Discuss the Christmas Lights competition.
